

# Doncaster and Salter's-Brook Turnpike.

## TOLLS TO BE LETT.


NOTICE is hereby given, That the next Meeting of the Trustees of and for this Road, is appointed to be at the House of Mrs. Eliz. Roper, the Sign of the White-Bear, in Barnsley, on Wednesday the 28th Day of April, 1784, for the Purpose of electing new Trustees in the Room of such as are dead or removed, or refuse to act; and also of letting the Tolls arising at the several Toll-Gates upon the said Turnpike-Road at SCAUSBY, HARPER-STABLES, ARDSLEY, KERESFORTH-HILL, and BOARDHILL, by Auction, to the best Bidder, between the Hours of Two and Six in the Afternoon, in the Manner directed in the Act passed in the 13th Year of the Reign of his present Majesty King George the Third, for regulating the Turnpike-Roads; which Tolls were lett for, and produced the last Year, the several Sums following, that is to say,

above all expences of collecting the same, and will be put up at the respective Sums abovementioned, only, as the Toll-Bar in Harper-Stables, which is a Ticket-Bar to both Scausby and Ardsley, has been discontinued a Part of the present Year, and an Advance of Rent on that Account agreed for, by and with the present Farmers of the said Bars at Scausby, and Ardsley; the Tolls arising or liable to be collected at Harper-Stables, will either be put up separate or jointly, and along with the Tolls arising at one or both of the said Toll-Bars at Scausby and Ardsley, pursuant to Conditions then and there to be produced and settled.

Whoever happens to be the best Bidder for, or at all or any of the said Toll-Gates, or Tolls collected, or liable to be paid and collected at the same respectively, must immediately at the Time and Place aforesaid, pay down as a deposit, in the Hands of the said Trustees, or their Clerk or Treasurer, one twelfth Part of the Sum for which he shall be declared the best Bidder, as the first Month's Rent in advance, for such Tolls so bid for by him as aforesaid; and also give Security with sufficient Sureties, to the Satisfaction of the said Trustees for the Performance of the Conditions stipulated, and Payment of the Rent agreed for, and at such Times and in such Manner as they shall direct; in Default whereof, the said Sum so paid, as the first Month's Rent, shall be forfeited, and the Trustees be at Liberty to re-lett the same Tolls, on neglect of such Security being given as aforesaid.
