

AN ACT TO REPEAL THE WADSLEY AND LANGSETT
TURNPIKE—ROAD ACT, 4TH JULY, 1838.

TOLLS.—For every horse, mule, ass, or other beast whatsoever drawing any coach, sociable, berlin, landau, barouche, chariot, vis-a-vis, chaise, chaise-marine, calash, landalet, phaeton, curricle, chair, gig, tax-cart, dog-cart, whiskey, hearse, litter, stage-coach, diligence, caravan, van, or other carriage of the like description, the sum of threepence.

For every horse, mule, or other beast whatsoever (except an ass), drawing any wagon, tug, wain, cart, dray, tumbril, or other wheel carriage of the like description, having the fellies of the wheels thereof of the breadth of six inches or upwards at the bottom or soles thereof, the sum of three-pence.

And having the fellies of the wheels thereof of less breadth than six inches, and not less than four inches and a half at the bottoms or soles thereof, the sum of four-pence.

And having the fellies of the wheels thereof of less width than four inches and half at the bottoms or soles thereof, the sum of four-pence halfpenny.

And for every ass drawing any waggons, tug, wain, cart, dray, tumbril, or other carriage of the like description, one half of the tolls above mentioned, regard being had to the breadth of the fellies of the wheels.

And whereas considerable quantities of milk are conveyed to the town of Sheffield and elsewhere in barrels or tin cans upon horses, mules or asses, which are generally conducted by boys, who (after having delivered their milk) frequently collect together and ride races, or proceed at so quick a pace as to make a great noise by the rattling of their empty barrels or cans, and thereby greatly annoy and molest passengers along the said road, and endanger the lives and limbs of such passengers, and several accidents have actually happened in consequence near the said town of Sheffield: and it was provided by the hereinbefore recited Act hereby repealed, that every owner of any horse, mule or ass conveying milk on the said Road, in barrels or cans, should have the name or names of the owner or owners of such horse, mule or ass in large legible letters, fixed to or upon some conspicuous part of the packsaddle upon or to which the barrels or cans should be attached, or upon the said barrels or cans.
