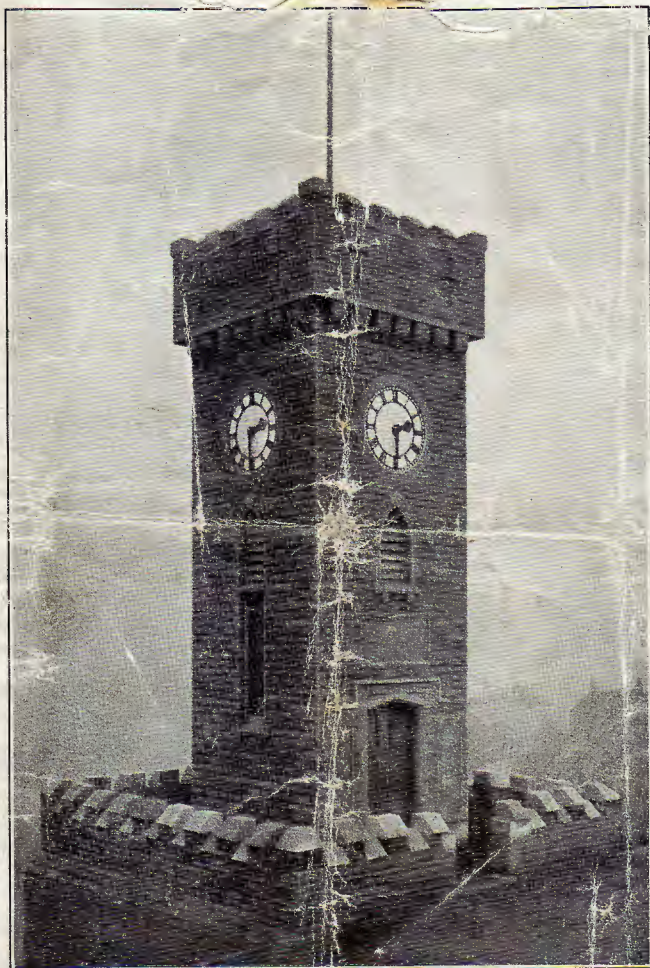

Alleluia!

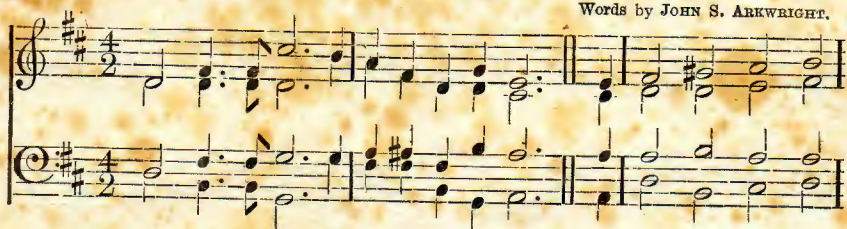
From earth's wide bounds, from ocean's farthest coast,

4. Mr. Wynyard Dixon, the Architect, will present the Key of the Tower to Mr. Wilson.
5. The Lord Bishop of Sheffield will dedicate the Memorial.
6. The Chairman of the War Memorial Committee will entrust the Memorial and the Deed of the Site to the custody of the Urban District Council and will hand the latter to the Chairman of the Council.
7. Major H. McIntyre will start the Clock and Chimes.
